




#### OBJECTIVES

#### ORGANOGRAM OF THE SOCIETY




## POLITICAL SET UP OF OPERATIONAL AREA



rom a bird's eye view,
Tripura is the third
smallest state in India
having an International
Frontier with Bangladesh (839
km). The geographical area of
Tripura is 10, 49, 169 hectors
and is holding the population of
36,71,032. The capital is
Agartala and the principal
languages are Bengali and
Kokborok.

It is a land-locked hilly state in North-Eastern India. It is surrounded by Bangladesh in the north, west and south. It is accessible to the rest of the state only through Cachar District of Assam and Aizawl District of Mizoram in the East. The state lies between 22.09 and 24.32' N latitudes and 90 09 and 92 10'E longitudes. From north to South its maximum Distance is about 184 kms and from east to west 113km. It was declared a union territory on 01/11/1959 and then later elevated to the status of full fledged State on 21-01-1972 Administratively the state is divided into 8 Districts.

The developmental interventions of JUST are spread in all the 8 districts of the State.


#### **General Introduction:**

he project aims to ensure the children from the target villages get quality primary education to improve the educational status of poor tribal Children under Ganganagar R.D. Block and reduce the gap of learning and to continue their education in formal schools. Accordingly 10 Education centers are set up at different location as a bridge schools. The children are also served nutritional food like Egg, Biscuits & Banana twice in a week in the center.

#### ACHIEVEMENTS

he special coaching classes have encouraged the drop out children and enabled them to continue their studies in formal school. The Centers are not only focusing on the intellectual development of the children but also on other good values such as good manners, health and hygiene etc.

The parents have become aware about the importance of education and they are seen taking keen interest in sending their children to the coaching centres.

Earlier the parents take their children to the jhum without sending them to the coaching centres but now they stop taking their children along with them and began sending them to the coaching centres.

The nutrition program in the coaching center is helping

the children in a big way in terms of regularity of children in the center and also in their studies. Children are so much encouraged and motivated to study with the introduction of this nutrition program.

The children were aware about the importance of health and hygiene earlier. Most of the children usually complain of stomach ache, diarrhoea and other health related problems. But after the implementation of the project they were given multiple times awareness on






health & hygiene and also provided health care materials. Through this awareness programme the children started maintaining good health & hygiene.

Children have improved in their health to some extent. Both the parents and the children have become aware about the importance of maintaining good health and hygiene. They stopped the bad habits of littering around and started keeping their surrounding clean.

#### **General Introduction:**

acilitating Agricultural Regeneration Measures (FARM Northeast-III) is being implemented in 6 villages under Hezamara R.D Block West Tripura and 8 villages under Padmabil R.D Block, Khowai Tripura. The project aims at "Empowering Community for Nutritional food intake through obtaining status of Food Sovereignty by adopting Organic farming, Horticulture and Animal husbandry as sustainable livelihood options".













#### Achievements:

- 382 families out of 605 families have started to utilize 80% of their cultivable land and have increased their production.
- · Kitchen garden is improved by the communities in the Project villages.
- · Youth are learning traditional farming system from their elders and are practicing.

- Out of 605 families 216 families have improved and developed their Seed banks.
- Out of 605 target families 216 families have enhanced food production only through indigenous seeds which are preserved by them.
- Communities are exchanging indigenous seeds and are multiplying them.
- 382 farming families out of

- 605 families are selling their organic agricultural products through direct marketing system.
- 2 new local markets are promoted and initiated by the communities in 2 project villages for the sale of their organic products.
- Organic vegetables are now regularly available in the local markets.










### FEEDING INDIA

s the impact of COVID-19 was still around, Feeding India had brought some consolation to the people through JUST. Feeding India by ZOMATO, a Nonprofit Organization which was aiming at reducing hunger among underserved communities in India, distributed 500 dry food kits in different



villages of Tripura in the month of March 2022. JUST facilitated the distribution. JUST selected the places and the beneficiaries for the distribution. The beneficiaries were the daily

laborers, Tea Garden workers and Landless laborers from Bishalgarh, Jampuijala, Chakmaghat and the outskirts of Agartala Town areas. Each beneficiary was given a pack of

10kgs of dry food which included Rice, Dal, Oil, etc... They were very happy to receive the support from ZOMATO through JUST. They expressed their satisfaction on receiving the food kit.



This farm is basically set up to train and encourage people to produce crops through organic process. Many SHGs have been trained and they have adopted organic farming process in their Agro practices. Integrated farming is practiced with a mini-cattle farm, fishery, livestock rearing, organic vegetable and varieties of Bamboos, Poultry and Orchirds.







The long time dream of our chairman and former directors is fulfilled in the name of JUST CENTRE. When Fr. Robert bought this land, he had this idea at the back of his mind. The land and the idea were kept protected till 2020 by the directors. Then on 8th January 2021 the foundation stone was laid by our beloved bishop Most Rev. the second year of its execution and it aims at empowering, Strengthening and enhancing the capacity of women socially, spiritually and politically and thereby promoting women's social emancipation. The project began from the month of December 2019



and various training programs have been conducted in different parishes as per the plan. The Project has been implemented in eight districts of Tripura and around 2300 women have participated in the various programs organized throughout the year.

Dr. Biswajit Debbarma MS TSBTC, Dr. Sanjana Goswami MD AGMC & GBPH Blood Bank and Chandan Sarkar President of SVBDA were the resource persons for the training. The resource persons shared about the importance of blood donation, health benefits after blood donation, when we can donate blood after getting vaccinated, crisis of blood in the blood bank, create network with the youth and how to organize blood donation campaign. The NGOs decided to undertake awareness program in collaborating with different NGOs and Tripura State Blood Transfusion Council (TSBTC).

#### **JUST Distributed Dry Rations**

Agartala, June 07: In the wake of Covid-19 2nd wave Jana Unnayan Samiti Tripura (JUST) in collaboration with Smile Foundation distributed dry rations to 140 families at Damdamia, Adharni Tea Garden and Nepali Basti under



West Tripura on 4th and 7th June 2021. JUST also celebrated World Environment Day and planted 110 saplings. Some these saplings were planted using 'Root Zone Fertigation' at JUST Farm Agro. Fr. Lathees the Director of JUST, spoke on Environment awareness and some of the safety measures of preventing COVID-19 such as maintaining social distance and wearing face mask while going outside for any purpose.

#### JUST celebrated Green Sunday



Agartala, June 22: JUST along with Diocese of Agartala have been celebrating 'Green Sunday' for the last 3 years by planting different types of fruits and tree saplings. This year on 20th June 2021 4th Green Sunday was celebrated in different parts of Tripura. In preparation for Green Sunday a Webinar was conducted on 14th June 2021 with the topic 'Ecosystem Restoration' for all the village leaders in which Dr. Wangdup Bhutia IFS the resource person shared about the important of environment and how to restore our ecosystem. On the occasion of 'Green Sunday' cleanliness drive, plantation and online drawing competition were conducted. All together 9000 saplings of different species were planted in different parts of Tripura. It was celebrated to encourage and aware the people the need to plant more saplings and to raise awareness of the environmental issues.

#### Don't depend on aids, generate own funds: Megasaysay awardee tells SHGs

Agartala, Nov 30: Reliance on charities for funds will not lead to development - waiting for government help or assistance from other Organization will only delay the progress of SelfHelp Groups (SHGs). Every SHG must generate adequate funds for expansion and growth, said Ramon Megasaysay awardee Kulandei Francis in Agartala.

Francis is a pioneer in ensuring selfreliance for rural people of Tamil Nadu through his 'Integrated Village Development Project (IVDP). Under the project over 14,600 SHGs spread over three districts of Tamil Nadu led around 2.65 lakhs people to selfreliance and prosperity. And, the



project - the SHGs as well - is not dependent on government or other organizations' help rather it is being run successfully through internal funding and Bank loans. Francis was

in the city a few days ago and held intensive interaction with selected SHGs at the JUST centre in Agartala and charted out plans for the growth of the SHGs. "Let the poor people

who are running SHGs get bank loans easily. Bank should disburse more loans for the revolving funds and extra funds required for expansion of individual SHGs".

He said, Bank lending to SHGs in Tripura is not satisfactory and this needs to be addressed. Moreover, the members of the individual SHGs must work harder with a vision to eradicate poverty and attain self reliance, the Megasaysay awardee said. He also stressed on the need for financial literacy and financial discipline for successful use and repayment of Bank loans.

Kulandei Francis added there are two crucial factors to attain self reliance 'equality' and 'self respect'. The

equality will ensure equal participation of all the members in the growth process of a SHG whereas self-respect will allow the SHG to work harder to generate funds for sustainable growth rather than expecting someone's

Continuing, he stressed on holistic empowerment of rural womenfolk through SHGs. Citing examples of the villages under the IVDP in Tamil Nadu, Francis said, "By women empowerment, I mean they should be able to take part in every activity

just like a man. SHGs members should ensure proper education, health care and skill development for women - this will enhance the self esteem of the women and help them to manage the SHG activities in a better way on the path of growth and prosperity".

Apart from interaction with SHG, Kulandei Francis visited Nortredum HS School at Moharpara under Telaimura recently and funded a project to make it a Smart school, "I have a plan to alleviate the school into a 'model school with technology' in future",

Francis said. Already, he has provided aids of worth over Rs 1 Crore directly to beneficiaries of Tripura using the DBT facilities. He concluded with a hope that SHGs in Tripura would bring a noticeable improvement in their socio-economic conditions.



he SFOORTI project which was for three years aimed at reduction of drudgery in women labour and affordability to boost their living standard and have a dignified life in their family and community in 60 targeted villages in four (4) districts of Tripura. The project is envisioned through increased income and sustainability by people's organization through SHGs, Cluster and federations.

#### **Beneficiary Details:**

Direct Beneficiary - 300 Indirect Beneficiary - 5,100 The three years projects has great impact on their socio- economic growth in the project targeted villages. The women's are now aware of entrepreneurship skills and market linkages through which small scale enterprise and other IGA activities are taken up to meet their basic needs. Through the project it also directly promotes people's

The Federations are now playing greater role in creating linkages between, in lines with Government department, NABARD Financial Services Limited (NABFINS), and other organization etc. The project is coordinated by seven experienced animators, in four (4) districts of Tripura covering 100 SHGs respectively.









#### **Achievements:**

- · Burburia federation had recieved a submersible water pump machine for their federation from Rural Development Block (RD Block) as the federation and nearby locality faced shortage of water. The member of the federation wrote an application, in the mid crisis of covid-19 pandemic in 2020. After continuous rapport building with the BDO, they receive a new submissive water pump facilities on 23rd of March 2022.
- SHGs are now having the concept of making fixed deposit in the bank for their

- future sustainability. Six federation and three SHG groups have fixed deposit. The federation and the group president are always taking proper measures to maintain all records.
- Federation members are now taking up small scale business, s u c h a s M u s h r o o m Cultivation, decoration services, poultry farm, uses of modern agriculture tools for increasing Agri-products, weaving in large scale and selling to direct merchant etc.
- Simari federation from Burburia is now taking their business to a new level, as they

- not only produce organic turmeric, but now they also produce red chilli powder and seasonal pumpkin after receiving livelihood support from JUST.
- After the linkages training the Federation and SHG members are now empowered and had









- linked their federation in line with governments departments, such as Agriculture, fisheries, NABFINS, KVK, RD Block, SDM offices, and availing other government schemes.
- SHG members are having an idea of taking ownership for their resources.





#### CASESTUDY

s. Nirubala Debbarma of Tivari Bodol from Belbari s one of the success Entrepreneur women. Her main source of earning i.e. means of business activity is mainly weaving and mushroom cultivation and had lots of experience, but due to financial condition she could not expands her business, as it needed to be purchased raw material for weaving such as threads and other machinery equipments and seeds for mushroom cultivation. Through the SFOORTI she attended different kind of entrepreneur training and session, through the project she was also linked to NABFINS micro finance

institute, where she availed Rs. 60,000/- for expanding her weaving and mushroom cultivation. Mrs. Nirubala also profited Rs. 17200/- from her mushroom cultivation in the month of December 2021, her investment was only Rs.5240/-. She also earns Rs. 58700/from her weaving business, as there is a high demand of traditional attire in the community. She also pays her loan amount timely to NABFINS and contributes her monthly income into the family. She is happy for the training and motivation that she received through the SFOORTI project and plans to open a weaving industry in her locality by engaging other member as a full time worker.





#### **General Introduction:**

JUST has entered into a partnership with ROTTENBURG in the initiative to empower the poor Reang Primitive Tribal families through SHG concept. The intervention is titled as "Reang's Integrated Self Empowerment - Program, by providing multiple options for income Generation. It is based on the formation of women into Self Help Groups (SHGs) with emphasis on converging services, developing access to micro credit and promoting micro enterprises. The long term objective of the project is to achieve an all-round empowerment of women, especially socially and economically by ensuring their direct access to, and control over, resources through a sustained process of mobilization and convergence of all ongoing programmes.







#### **Activities:**

- 25 Women SHGs were formed during the three year period. Besides 25 existing groups are strengthened by frequent monitoring their functions and conducting various Training to the members of the existing SHGs. In view of strengthening the existing SHG's, capacity building training were organized for the group leaders every year.
- Out of 548 SHG members 354 members are engaged in viable micro enterprises through improved vocational skills and livelihood support.
- 90 SHG members are enhanced with adequate skills in rearing Livestock.
- 46 SHGs are practicing livestock rearing.
- 28 SHGs out of 50 SHGs have availed access to Government livelihood entitlements and micro credit from financial institutions.
- Through awareness program the people have become aware about the importance of proper sanitation and hygiene.






