To promote a nd sustain mass campaign to eradicate ignorance and poverty among the poor and downtrodden through awareness building, motivation-trining empowerment and local organization.





Political Set up of Operational Area



From a bird's eye view, Tripura is the third smallest state in India having an international frontier with Bangladesh (839 km). The geographical area of Tripura is 10,491 km with a population of 36.71 lakh (3.67 million). The capital is Agartala and the principal languages are Bengali and Kokborok. Its is a land-locked with hilly state in North-Eastern India, it is surounded by Banaladesh in the north, west and South, it is acesible to the rest of the state only through Cacher District of Assam and Aizawal Distrit of Mizoram in the East. The state lies between 22.09 and 24.32' N longtitudes. From north to South its maximum Ddistance is about 184kms and from East to west 113 kms.

it was declared a union territory on 01/11/1959 and then later elavated to the states of full fledged State on 21/01/1972. Administratively the State is divided into 8 Districts.

The Developmental interventions of JUST are spread in all the 8 districts of the State.

Minimizing School Drop-Out of the Indigenous Tribal Children in Karbook, Tripura/India





General Introduction of the Project:

Just implemented 10 Remedial Education centres profiting 360 children in the neediest rural areas of Tripura. The area chosen for the project is Karbook subdivision under Gomati District, Tripura, Mostly inherited by the tribes such as Tripura, Reang, Uchoi and Mog. The people of the areas are mostly farmers and daily wage laborers, they could hardly afford for their children education. The implementation of the project brought a good impact on the people and their way of assuming about quality education and its importance in their lives and even setting a good example to the other neighboring villages. The children are provided with learning materials such as notebooks, pen, pencil, eraser and games items. The children are also served nutritional food such as Egg, Biscuits, Bread, Cake, banana thrice a week in all the centres. It is to keep the children away from the malnourishment and keep them active in their studies.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

10 Teachers were successfully trained and acquired teaching skills at the starting of the project.

After receiving study materials, the children have been boosted the interest and self-esteem of the children and motivated them to go to school throughout the year and complete their lessons given by the teacher.

Parents-Teachers Association have been formed in the centers to bring a mutual trust and understanding between them and as support and cooperativeness from parents to teacher can help a lot to connect with the children smoothly.

Being distributed Sports items such as, football, skipping rope and chess the children are engaged in games and sports and other extra-curricular activities. It keeps the children even more active in their studies.

The children had set up an example for the villages by planting trees and doing cleanliness drive programs in the village roadside and school ground to promote clean environment and free plastic pollution.

All the children participate in various competitions on the annual sports day such as running race competitions, skipping rope competition for the girls and frog jump for the children and football for the senior boys and the winners are awarded with prizes.

Children's day is also celebrated in all the centres, on this day the teacher makes the children to involved in group activities such as drawing and handwriting competitions and compete each other in group and the winning group will be awarded with prizes.

The children have become aware of health care and hygiene. They practice daily both at home and outside the home such as washing hand before and after eating, washing their body with soap, eat healthy and clean food, keep their nails clean, throwing the biscuits wrap in the dustbin.

Examinations are conducted twice a year in all the centres regularly which is very important for the project for checking whether the coaching class is helping in learning their lessons well and improve in their learning skills.

Children parliament program are conducted in the centres regularly. Such as program on child rights, street play on drug addiction and pollution free environment.







The children are now enjoying the classes and participating actively in the classroom activities.

DIFFICULTIES AND STRUGGLES FACED BY THE FAMILY

Manik Tripura is a resident of Mohanta Para, Bhagaban Tilla, Karbook Gomati District and studying in Class 7. Due to financial issues his parents were unable to afford him in a good school and a home tutor and he was losina an interest in studies as he had no proper guidance at home. In the vear 2022 JUST implemented a project in their village and opened a coaching centre. Manik Tripura was enrolled in the coaching centre by a teacher appointed by JUST from the nearby village. Now he is attending a regular class and being active in all the activities done in the centre. As he always dreamt of studying in English School, he still could not make unto it due to financial issues, but he is learning a basic English language from the teacher by joining the coaching class. He and his parents are really thankful to JUST for giving him such an opportunity which he always dreamt of it.

JUST AGRO FARM

Agro Farm at Damdamia managed by JUST has set an example by producing vegetables and fruits through organic farming process. This farm is basically set up to train and encourage people to produce crops through organic process. Many SHGs have been trained and they have adopted organic farming process in their Agro practices. Integrated farming is practiced with a mini-cattle farm, fishery, livestock rearing, organic vegetable and varieties of Bamboos,

CONTINUATION OF EDUCATION CENTERS AGAINST SCHOOL DROP-OUT OF THE INDIGENOUS REANG IN AGARTALA

General Introduction:

The project aims to ensure the children from the target villages get quality primary education to improve the educational status of poor tribal Children under Ganganagar R.D. Block and reduce the gap of learning and to continue their education in formal schools. Accordingly 10 Education centers are set up at different locations as a bridge school. The children are also served nutritional food like Egg, Biscuits & Banana twice in a week in the center.

ACHIEVEMENTS

The enrolment of children in the school has increased as JUST Coaching teachers ensure children's regular attendance through improved method of teaching to keep children interested as well as making family members aware about the importance of education.

Many parents appreciated the efforts of JUST and agreed that children became more vocal and expressive with the help of this program. Parents have also noted that children are seen taking initiative to go to school and children have gained confidence.

Graduating to Main stream school (Achievement)
Many students after studying in JUST Coaching
Centers get encouraged to enroll in the government
school. In the year 2022, 77 students (from a total of
350 students) enrolled into government school. Most
of the admissions were to class-V & above but in few
cases there were also admission in other classes. In
Udasing Para for instance 14 children entered in
class-VI, 3 in class-IV and 3 in class-III

In the villages normally, children don't have warm clothes during the winter season as their parents cannot afford to provide them. The children usually come to the coaching classes without warm clothes severing in the cold. So, JUST provided good quality sweater to 300 children with the support from KINDER MISSIONS WERK. After receiving the sweater, the children were very excited and happy with the sweater. Now they don't have to face the problem of severing with cold after using the sweater.





CASE STUDY I

JUST Coaching Center of
Birgurampara is located in one of
the most interior village. There are
45 households in the village. The
parents from this village wanted to
send their children to the school but
the Government School is very far
(around 3 kms). And it is difficult for
little children to walk so far. In
addition, there is a stream that
separates the village from the rest of
the village and so it would become
even more difficult for the children
to go across during rains.

Several village meetings and discussions on the issue resulted into formation of coaching centers supported by JUST in March 2020. An open space was assigned to run the Center. A local teacher Mr. Bidyut Reang was appointed and was given trainings from JUST. In the beginning the children were not regular because they did not feel comfortable in the open space. Mr. Bidyut requested for a room to run the coaching centre in the village meeting. He also kept motivating the parents to send their children to the coaching centre on regular basis. After a couple of months a small room was rented for the coaching centre. There were as many as 31 children who got enrolled including 19 girls and 12 boys.



Mr. Bidyut is very passionate about his work. He is amazed that in a very short time the children have learnt reading and writing skills. The children are very happy with Mr. Bidyut and enjoy learning with him. He proudly says-"The children of his coaching centre are better students than those who go to the Government School."

"He who has health has hope; and he who has hope has everything". Jana Unnayan Samiti Tripura healthcare initiatives are as much inspired from this proverb, as they are from its own experience and understanding that in order to make a child continue his/her education, it is very important to keep him/her and the family healthy. And that is the primary reason why JUST focuses on providing healthcare to the underprivileged children by providing nutritious food.



FACILITATING AGRICULTURAL RESILIENT MEASURES FARM NORTHEAST PROGRAME



General Introduction:

Facilitating Agricultural Regeneration Measures was implemented in 6 villages under Hezamara R.D Block West Tripura and 8 villages under Padmabil R.D Block, Khowai Tripura till October 2022, Since November 2022 the programme is being implemented in 2 villages under Hezamara R.D. Block, West Tripura, 7 villages under Amarpur R.D Block and 3 villages under Karbook R.D Block, Gomati District. The project aims at "Empowering Community for Nutritional food intake through obtaining status of Food Sovereignty by adopting Organic farming, Horticulture and Animal husbandry as sustainable livelihood options".

415 families have increased food production through natural farming practices

Grinding machine support led to positive change – Communities are buying fresh turmeric powder from the grinding machine group instead of depending on commercially available powder

Youths are learning traditional farming system from their elders and are practicing

415 families have improved individual seed banks

225 have indigenous seeds for food production

Communities are demanding only traditional seeds to minimize hybrid seeds from the line departments.

Communities are exchanging indigenous seeds and are multiplying them.

382 farming families are selling their organic agricultural products through direct marketing

213 Farmers are exchanging their indigenous seeds

One new local market was promoted and two old markets were revived by the communities in two project villages for the sale of their organic products. Organic vegetables are now regularly available in the local markets.

JUST SHG EXPOSURE TO IVDP





The 14 member Team of JUST including our Director Fr. Lathees visited IVDP, Krishnagiri, from 3 to 8 September 2022. The Members were selected in view of Creating SHGs in all our Parishes. On the first day the Team was taken to the field to see and learn systematic way of conducting SHG meetings. During the visit the IVDP SHG Women shared their experiences of being an SHG member for many years and the benefits of being part of IVDP. They also shared about the systematic way of documentation, conducting meetings without failure, unityamong the SHG Women, Insurance Policy during death and 100 percent recovery on inter-loaning. On the second day the Team visited the Cluster Level Federation (CLF) Office. Interactions were done with the Federation Members and also with the Bank Managers regarding the functioning of the Federations and regarding Schemes availed by the IVDP SHGs. JUST Team also visited dif fervent villages, where SHG Members are engaging themselves in different Income Generation activities. After that the Founder/President of IVDP Mr. Kulandai Francis, interacted with the Team and explained about how IVDP is functioning, how they monitor the SHGs, and the purpose of forming SHGs.

Livelihood support to most vulnerable families of Tripura





Livelihood support to most vulnerable families of Tripura Programme was implemented mainly for the existing SHG members of 6 Districts of Tripura. The project aims at Enabling most vulnerable families of Tripura for sustainable livelihood towards economic stability and also bring positive changes for the SHGs to build resilience through income generation. The objective of the project is to increase annual household income through promotion of diversified livelihood activities such as poultry, goatery, cattle rearing, providing Agri-product processing, Seed support, etc.

EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES AND INSTITUTIONS FOR PEACE BUILDING IN NORTHEAST INDIA

General introduction

The project aims at buildingrelations with different communities living in Tripura.to have mutual respect, reduce violence, confidence-building measures and build bridges of trust in each other and live in harmony. The project empowers and strengthens to encourage reconciliation to the target groups for promoting peace in educational institutions, civil society, and inter-religious organizations for violence reduction, mutual exchanges. and learning to lead to peace and harmony in Tripura. It is implemented in 20 Schools, 2 youth clubs, and 6 SHGs Federations.





Activities

Need-based state-level workshop for religious leaders.

Visit to special homes by school peace club members.

Central-level orientation and capacity building for the youth peace volunteers.

Youth training on local resource mobilization for the sustainable peace-building process.

Training on right-based leadership skills for community leaders.

Capacity building for youth and SHGs for confidence-building measures to trust each other.

Inter-youth gathering for peace at the district level.

Networking meeting for NGOs, FBOs, CSOs and like-minded people.

Achievements

The new peace club members are taking initiatives with their friends in promoting peace in the schools.

The peace club members gained the confidence to conduct school activities themselves and maintain discipline in the school.

Awareness on substance abuse and negative impacts of excessive social media usage are being imparted in classroom teachings by the School Peace Animators.

The women's peace club members and Youth club have increased their confidence level through trainings like communication skills, conflict resolution, right-based and leadership skills, capacity building, and local resource mobilization.

The two-youth peace clubs, Maharaja Bir Bikram Cluband Force Union Club are taking responsibilities for reducing social evils and promoting sports and farming activities in the villages.

The women's peace club members have developed trust among themselves and build their confidence from the trainings they received. They also take a step in promoting peace through reducing social evils in the society.

Special Coaching and Care for the Children (Supported by SMILE Foundation)

The goal of the project is to offer special coaching and care to the children under the elementary school in order to assure adequate physical growth and knowledge in the educationunder the Mission Education program of JUST at Damdamia, Nepali Basti and Adharni Tea Garden.









Women Empowerment through Capacity Building Programs

General Introduction of the Project

Women Empowerment through Capacity building programs is a project of JUST being implemented in 15 Parishes of Agartala Diocese. The Project is in the third and final year of its execution and it aims at empowering, Strengthening and enhancing the capacities & healthof women, socially, spiritually and politically and thereby promoting women's social emancipation. The project began from the month of December 2019 and various training programs have been conducted in different parishes as per the plan.

The Project has been implemented in eight districts of Tripura and around 2500 women have participated in the various programs organized throughout the year. Thus in this final year the program has created awareness among the women to have a healthy society through various health education sessions arranged for them.

Women were able to understand the concept of mental health, general causes and various types of mental health, and the preventive measures and the removal of stigma from the minds of the people. They were also able raise certain doubts and clarify them.

Mothers have come to know of the importance of natal care and that they are able to give better care to the pregnant and lactating mothers.

Mother's day celebration has helped them to identify their own worth and they feel happy and acknowledged for the work they do at home without counting the cost.

In the annual meet of Women more than 300 women/mothers participated and gave it gave boost to them as they have come to know their capabilities and the input sessions on leadership were also very effective.




